Introduction

The Design Review Committee is working on a Landscaping Master Plan for Quiet Water. When the plan is complete, it will be submitted to the membership for approval. To guide the planning process and help ensure a proposed master plan is consistent with the wishes of a majority of homeowners, we are would like for each homeowner to submit a survey. We are offering both a web survey as well as a paper option. Responses submitted on paper will be manually entered in the web system to facilitate tabulation and reporting. A summary of the results will be published when the results have been tabulated. Responses from individuals will be kept confidential. Your response is important and will help guide the landscaping planning process for our community.

The Quiet Water community is a diverse mix of people and interests. Some owners have owned property for more than 15 years while others purchased more recently. One thing we all share is ownership and interest in the common area. The design process will seek compromise where possible when it does not conflict with the wishes of a majority of homeowners or state and federal regulations. This survey will guide the future appearance of all common area so participation is important.
